The East Iowa Ski Club's first West trip of the 2023 season to the Snowmass/Aspen ski areas, Jan 21 – 28, 2023 got off to a great start at the June 4th Spring Picnic. The 24 spots for members staying at the Top of the Village complex in four 3br/3bth ski-in/ski-out condos went quickly. The trip sold out much more quickly than anticipated and a Wait List has already been cre-



ated. The great skiing at Snowmass is always enjoyable and the convenient, free shuttle service to the 3 other mountains Aspen, Aspen Highlands and Buttermilk make this a special destination. This trip has been priced as a drive yourself/carpool trip like other Colorado destinations. The club has worked out a round trip airline ticket option into the Aspen airport at an extra cost, for those who would prefer to fly instead of drive. Your Trip Leader will have pricing and additional details.

Kathy Takes and Kari Wheeler are the volunteer Trip Leaders & hosts on this great skiing adventure. If you did not get signed up before the trip sold out, please add your name to the Wait List. There is usually a cancellation and an opportunity to sign up later. At Snowmass we will be staying at the Top of the Village - the ultimate in ski-in ski-out condo lodging. Spacious condos surrounded on three sides by mountains and forests. You will experience a network of trails directly outside of the door and can literally ski right onto the slopes. Each unit has a fully equipped kitchen, fireplace, washer-dryer, gas grill, and private balcony or patio. The TOV offers an outdoor heated pool, two outdoor hot tubs, fitness room and sauna. The other 3 mountain resorts are very accessible. The Roaring Fork Transit Authority (RFTA) provides a FREE and extensive bus service within Aspen villages until 2 a.m. Below are some descriptions of the mountains we will be skiing.

Snowmass is massive enough to offer up every type of terrain from serene to extreme. Snowmass has 3,332 acres of terrain, 94 trails, 21 chairlifts and access to your choice of cruisers, glades and steeps. Snowmass has 4,406 vertical foot drop, which is the most in the country. Seven on-mountain restaurants offer places to pause and rest, which you'll need after trails that stretch as long as five miles. No other mountain offers the variety of experiences you'll find at Snowmass.

Aspen Mountain, with its famous black-diamond terrain, has kept us on the map since 1947. Inbounds you'll get a variety of glades, bumps and steeps. While the mountain hasn't changed much, you'll appreciate the new gondola, great views & food at the Sundeck at the summit and Ajax Tavern at the base, where the après rivals the skiing. Base elevation: 7,945 ft. Summit elevation: 11,212 ft. Number of trails: 76, Types of trails: easiest: 0%, more difficult: 48%, most difficult: 26%, expert: 26%.

With breathtaking 360-degree views of the Maroon Bells and an abundance of expert terrain as well as groomed cruisers, it's no wonder Aspen Highlands has been the locals' favorite for over 50 years. Hike the 12,392 feet to the summit of Highland Bowl for the ultimate inbounds backcountry rush. Or take the Deep Temerity lift to access the recently-added 237 skiable acres. It all adds up to some of the most challenging big-mountain terrain in North America. Base elevation: 8,040 ft., Summit elevation: 11,675 ft.. (top of Highland Bowl 12,392 ft.) Number of trails: 118, Types of trails: easiest: 18%, more difficult: 30%, most difficult: 16%, expert: 36%.

Buttermilk built its 50-year legacy on wide-open and gently rolling trails that cater to beginners and families. Today it's famous for hosting the X Games through 2014 and being voted #1 by Transworld Snowboarding Magazine Reader's Poll for best pipe. The 22-foot super-pipe in the legendary terrain park does not disappoint, as many X Games winners, Olympians and up-and-comers can attest. Base elevation: 7,870 ft. Summit elevation: 9,900 ft. Number of trails: 44, Types of trails: easiest: 35%, more difficult: 39%, most difficult: 26%, expert: 0%.

Copper Mountain trip, Feb 20 - 26, 2023

The East Iowa Ski Club's Copper Mountain trip sold half of the available spots at the Spring Picnic. If you are interested in joining us at Copper Mountain, please contact Dale and Rhonda Bohrer, who have volunteered to be trip leaders on this ski adventure. There is currently room for 16 members to stay in Mountain

Plaza complex in the Center Village. The club has 8 condos, 2br/2bth in this walk-in/walk-out location - across the plaza from the lifts (3-minute walk).

This EISC trip is scheduled as a 6 night, Monday through Sunday, Feb 20-26; drive yourself/carpool trip. We have the option to park at the resort early Monday (2/20/23), ski all day and check in that afternoon. This should work out great for those who want to travel to the Denver area on Sunday, then drive into Copper Mountain early for skiing on Monday morning and avoid the weekend traffic. The club got special group pricing on the condos with this unusual schedule and five of six-day lift tickets.

Copper Mountain is a 2,507-acre resort that has an excellent variety of naturally differentiated terrain that gets more challenging from west to east, and a seriously underrated high alpine filled with adventure terrain—plus a free Snow-cat ride to maximize your time there.

The resort has a huge variety of terrain spread across this large resort, so there are plenty of options for every level. Great, long groomers in both lower-intermediate and upper-intermediate ranges. Much more and better tree skiing than most people know. For those wanting to improve their skiing, Copper is one of the best resorts

to learn to ski thanks to stellar learning programs, (slightly) lower prices, and a down-to-earth vibe that makes you want to hang a little longer.

The vibe at Copper is somehow simultaneously hip and refreshingly old-school: Go have some damn fun. Copper sees—and markets—itself as the rebel force to the corporate imperial army down the road. It works.

Copper's guests enjoy steps away lodging, apres ski entertainment, naturally divided terrain, exciting events and a welcoming, knowledgeable staff. The base elevation is 9,712 feet and the summit is at 12,441 feet. There are over 140 marked trails (21% beginner, 25% intermediate, 36% advanced, 18% expert) and 24 chair-lifts making Copper one of the largest ski resorts in Colorado.

The Mountain Plaza complex is known for its spacious and comfortable accommodations conveniently located at the base of the American Eagle Lift in the Center Village. On-site indoor and outdoor hot tubs, sauna, dining and a lobby warmed by its gas fireplace make Mountain Plaza a good choice to enjoy a relaxed mountain environment, while being steps away from skiing. The building, built in 1979, features complimentary wi-fi, heated underground parking and laundry facilities. 1 vehicle per unit with a kitchen receives garage parking. Additional vehicles may park in the free outlying lots or choose to pay for parking in the interior village lots.

Copper Mountain is on the Ikon Pass. Pass holders get unlimited access to the resort. The Copper Mountain trip currently has 16 spots left for the trip.
