We know that when there is a snow fall getting out on the trails soon is important to many skiers. Please use the club's web site Forums to post your desire to get others to join you!



EISC Camping / Bicycling / Exploring Trip Weekends

The EISC Camping Committee has organized two camping weekends with optional bicycle rides on nearby trails this upcoming season. The camping and bicycle trails are near interesting lowa cities for those who would just like to explore & have fun with friends from the EISC. There will be a hotel option for those who want to ride bikes or explore and are not necessarily interested in the camping aspect of the weekend.

The first camping / bicycling weekend will be Friday, June 14 through Sunday, June 16 at Pulpit Rock Campground, near Decorah. The bicyclers will be riding on the 11-mile Trout Run Trail. There are many attractions in the Decorah area to explore... The camper's plan is to arrive on Thursday to find a good spot, while the hotel folks plan to arrive Friday afternoon, June 14 or early Saturday morning, with the bike ride starting at 9:00 on Saturday, June 15. After the ride, several members are planning to visit our friends at the Toppling Goliath Brewery at 1600 Prosperity Rd. We had a great time visiting with Ron Saboe and Brew Master, Mike Saboe, the last time we visited Decorah. We plan to return home on Sunday, June 16. The hotel for the members who prefer not to camp will be named later.

Pulpit Rock campground registration opens on March 2 at 8:00am. Kim suggests campsites 101, 102, 106, 114, 115, 119-121 which are in the same circle and all are reservable. Sites 121 & 106 are pull through and will allow two campers, so if you could reserve one of these, when we get to camping day and we have a last-minute add-on. they can be accommodated. All these sites are



adjacent to tent camping as well, so tent camp sites 24-29 for tent campers are reservable. (See pic) See the Ski club website for links and more information.

The second camping weekend has been set up for Friday September 27 through Sunday Sept. 29. The camper's plan is to arrive on Thursday again at Howell Station Campground on Lake Red Rock near Pella. Please contact Kim for more information on camping at this nice Army Corp of Engineers Campground. Sept 28 is a Hawkeye bye week. The hotel folks plan to arrive on Friday afternoon, Sept 27 to prepare for the Saturday bicycle ride. Saturday, Sept 28 at 9:00 the EISC will be riding the Volgweg trail that runs from Pella towards the Howell Station Campground and along the north shore of Lake Red Rock. There are many attractions to explore along with all of the Dutch history to learn about & enjoy in the Pella area. The hotel for the members who prefer not to camp will be named later. The group will spend Saturday evening in Pella and plans to return home Sunday, Sept 29.

Campers, plan to reserve campsites 104-110 which are along the river. They open up six months in advance rolling day by day. So, it is critical you reserve your site on March 28 when the September 28 day opens up. You can then reserve that day and the days after it. Contact Kim for more information.

More information on both of these bike rides will be coming in future Skiddoos. This is a great way to kick off our EISC Camping Committee's first season and keep our members ski conditioning up through bicycle rides. We hope to schedule several training day rides through the summer. Thanks!


EISC 2024 Four Person Best Shot Golf Outing!
