
An incentive for members is, if your guest decides to become a member, you will receive a five-dollar Ski Bucks credit towards a future trip/activity.

Twenty-four ski club members will be exploring the captivating Canyonlands of the southwest and experience spellbinding landscapes on this unforgettable National Parks tour!

Highlights of this National Parks tour are visits to the Grand Canyon, Bryce Canyon National Park, and Zion National Park, as well as staying inside Grand Canyon National Park.



We will visit Monument Valley, so have your camera ready for some spectacular shots during your 4-wheel-drive tour of mystical Monument Valley and its massive formations. At Navajo National Monument, visit the visitor center and view artifacts of the villages that date from 1250 to 1300 AD built by the prehistoric Puebloan Ancestors.

We will also visit Glen Canyon Dam—the country's second-highest concrete-arch dam—which holds back Lake Powell, the country's second-largest man-made lake. Finally, we'll visit Snow Canyon State Park, a park featuring soaring sandstone cliffs.




The first major EISC West trip of the 2022 season is back to Breckenridge! This area has activities for skiers and non-skiers. Breckenridge is a very unique town with a variety of activities available. The towns of Fisco and Silverthorn are also within a 15-minute drive.

Breckenridge 2020

This mountain offers fantastic skiing for all abilities and is spread out over 2,908 acres, which includes 5 peaks! We have 19 people signed up so far, with room for 32 (8 2BR/2Bath suites) staying at the Beaver Run resort. This ski in/ski out resort is one of Breckenridge's most popular.



The Beaver Run Resort offers a variety of amenities including an indoor/outdoor heated pool, a second outdoor pool, nine outdoor hot tubs, an exercise room, video arcade, retail stores, mini market/deli, bars and restaurants, ski and snowboard rental shops and complimentary in-town shuttle.

Parking is restricted during the winter to 1 vehicle per bedroom at a \$20 per day fee, so carpooling is suggested to keep the cost down.

EISC members will have to order their own Epic passes online. The EISC recommends using the SKI.com link <https://epicikon.events.ski.com/> to buy your pass as SKI.com offers a credit of \$30 on all Epic (except the Epic Day) Passes, when used on one of the EISC trips.

All Epic Passes are currently selling at 20% less than last year.

The early sales success for the second major EISC West trip was evidenced by those attending the June Spring Picnic. This is no doubt a reflection of the fine effort by our own noble literary laureate, **Steve Cummings**, plus an early "adverteasing" blitz. To date, the trip roster holds 22 Adventure-Nauts, we have room for six more members.

Located in Heber Valley, in the heart of the Wasatch Mountains, you will find the Zermatt Resort and Spa. This is a specially designed European styled vacation, featuring lodging in a Swiss inspired village which offers many great amenities. The property is a luxury 4 star, 4 diamond, full-service resort. You will enjoy the on-property indoor/outdoor swimming pools and hot-tubs, wellness center, full-service day spa, pub, two distinct restaurants, a Swiss bakery and complimentary shuttle service to Deer Valley, Park City, Midway and Heber Valley.



There will be complimentary shuttle to Sundance Resort for groups. Our accommodations will feature 2 bedroom/ 2 bath, 1200 sq. ft. villas, including full-kitchens, fireplaces, decks/patios and Alpenhorns.

Zermatt Resort and Spa is the perfect accommodation hub for all the adventure and recreation we can pack into a week. Our knowledgeable on-site host is Maxine Jensen.

She has a wealth of talent and promises to provide our group with plenty of skiing and non-skiing activities, plus she will actively participate in a few of the special opportunities. Those alpine skiing/riding will be drawn to the variety afforded by Park City Mountain Resort, Deer Valley(ski only) and Sundance Resort, all within a 15-30 minute shuttle ride, plus the possibility of day trips to experience other unique alpine skiing endeavors.

Lift tickets are not included and the best approach to handle what will work for your situation can be explored in Steve's most current Ski Pass Skidoo article. Those members that have come to their senses can enjoy the "sky is your limit" alternatives to alpine skiing/riding. Nordic skiing and snow-shoeing, plus gear rental, is available at Soldier Hollow Nordic Center (prime 2002 Olympic venue), Wasatch State Park and Sundance Resort Nordic Center.

Snow tubing, snowmobiling, sleigh rides, ice-skating, fishing and hiking are a few other outdoor activities that can be experienced close at hand.

Something everyone in our group should consider is a "dip your toes" experience at "The Crater", a geothermal, crystal-blue, spring hidden within a 55 foot, beehive-shaped limestone rock located at the Homestead Resort in Midway. Another highly recommended, whole group experience, is a day trip to the Sundance Resort.

There are live participation activities, such as, silver-smithing, making cheese and candles and having a refreshment out of sight of Joe Le Fors and The Pinkertons at the Owl Bar where scenes from Redford and Newman's portrayal of Sundance and Butch were filmed. Plus, you can experience Alpine, Nordic and snow-shoeing activities. As former Founder and Owner, Robert Redford said, "Sundance is an arts community, a recreational community, a community of people who appreciate the

beauty of nature and feel the responsibility to preserve it.” We should fit in pretty well!

Also, exploring the historic village of Midway and quaint offerings of Heber City, one will find great eats, shopping, cool history and cultural influences without the escalated cost of admission compared to Park City.

As many of our members are experienced in travel, they are increasingly aware of the importance in protection of their travel investment with trip insurance.



Fishing trip to Lake of the Woods: July 30 - August 6, 2022
Sportsman's Lodge, Baudette, Minnesota
Estimated Cost \$1500/person double occupancy



Have you ever wanted to do a fishing trip to the great north woods of Minnesota? This all-inclusive but drive yourself there trip may be the easiest and best trip you could come across to fish and explore one of the most scenic lakes in northern Minnesota – Lake of the Woods. All you need is to pack a suitcase and “drive” to Baudette, Minnesota – an easy 500-mile day trip. This all-inclusive trip includes a double occupancy room in their spacious lodge, all your meals, and four full days of fishing in a guided boat.

The lodge has a total of 30 standard lodge rooms. Each room has two queen beds, a full bathroom, and television with HBO, Wi-Fi, writing table, chairs and a freezer for your daily catch. All rooms are air conditioned; towels are provided and maid service is provided daily.

The meal plan included with this trip, includes three meals each full day starting with dinner on the day you arrive and breakfast on the day you leave. Dinner includes a full salad bar and soup, bread, a nonalcoholic beverage, and your choice from a large selection of steaks, seafood, walleye, chicken or ribs. They also offer a wide selection of wine, spirits, and desserts which can be enjoyed for an extra charge. For breakfast, you can choose from a large selection of egg dishes, omelets, pancakes and more. Lunch is a choice of a box lunch or shore lunch. The “Sandbar” overlooking the water is open from noon until late evening to relax at on your off days from fishing.

You can feel comfortable fishing with four other ski club friends from a 27’ Sportcraft with onboard restroom, cabin cuddy and covered top. No equipment or experience is required. You just need to purchase your own fishing license. Your Coast Guard licensed guide will take care of all your fishing needs including putting you on the fish, and with over 14,500 islands, 65,000 miles of shoreline, and nearly one million acres of water you will appreciate the 200 years of guide experience between all of their guides.

You can either carpool, or drive yourselves to Baudette, Minnesota leaving Saturday, July 30th. Check in time is 3:00 pm. You'll just want to get there in time for dinner. You'll depart for home on the next Saturday, August 6th.

GUIDELINES FOR EAST IOWA SKI CLUB

Whether you are a skier – downhill or X-C, snowboarder, bicyclist, kayaker, golfer, fisherman, hiker, or enjoy adventure/leisure tours, you will find exciting activities and tours geared to your interests and abilities with the East Iowa Ski Club. Join us and enjoy the camaraderie of some of the greatest people in this state. We guarantee a good time or double your efforts back!

BECOMING A MEMBER:

To be member of the East Iowa Ski Club requires a completed membership form and the payment of annual dues. Our website is eastiowaskiclub.com and mailing address is East Iowa Ski Club, PO Box 843, Cedar Rapids, IA 52506-3162. Annual dues are good for 12 months from the date you joined or renewed:

- \$30 for an individual 18 years and over
- \$60 for a household (everyone living in one household, including under 18)
- \$5 for a one-time Trial membership, good for 3 months to new members only

There are some events where membership is not necessary, however you are required to register. All guests sign in at every meeting.

TO SIGN UP FOR AN ACTIVITY:

1. Talk with the trip chairperson, sign up and arrange payment.

2. On the website, log-in, select the activity from the event calendar and register. You can send a check to the PO Box or pay with a credit card online.

*A full deposit or first payment must be made for your position to be held on the list of trip takers.

*If the activity/trip chairperson takes your name but no money, you are on the waiting list only. The trip could sell out before you are contacted!

WAITING LIST:

As trips fill, activity chairpersons accumulate additional names for a waiting list. The names are kept in order of receipt, and members are notified in that order when a vacancy occurs on the trip. We cannot guarantee spaces for people on the waiting list so get your money in early. You can accept a position that opens or decline, you are not under obligation.

EVENT PRICES AND ROOM ARRANGEMENTS:

Your EISC works diligently to offer you the lowest trip rates obtainable. Please remember that all trip prices are subject to change. Sleeping arrangements in condos or hotels are normally one queen or 2 twins, we attempt to match up beds to couples/singles. For this reason, we advise you to come prepared with your roommate.

In the event you don't we will attempt to place you with a same sex roommate; however, it is not guaranteed. If you would prefer to room by yourself or don't have a roommate in mind, you have the option to pay the single supplement charge.

All trip takers look forward to their vacations and pay a lot of money to participate, SO in consideration of others, **only** paid trip participants are eligible to stay overnight in a condo/hotel.

TRIP INSURANCE:

Insurance is recommended and available to purchase via the travel agency that design our ski trips, or it is also available from travel insurance websites.

CROSS COUNTRY SKIING & SNOWSHOEING:

Trip chairpersons try to indicate the availability of cross country and snowshoeing trails. Please let the trip chairperson know if you intend to cross country and/or snowshoe.

REFUND/CANCELLATION POLICY:

**Authorized* cancellation: If a trip taker notifies the trip chairperson of intent to cancel before the deadline established for that trip, all monies paid will be refunded.

**Late* cancellation – If a trip taker cancels after the established cancellation date for the trip and notifies the trip chairperson, a refund MAY be eligible provided a fully paid replacement is found.

If no replacement is found, the cancelling trip taker is responsible for unrecoverable costs.

**Unauthorized* cancellation – A person who does not notify the trip chairperson forfeits the cost of the trip.

RESPECTABILITY:

An obligation for EISC membership – the EISC has members from all attitudes and ages of life. The Board therefore, feels it is important that considerations of respectability be given to all concerned when in travel or otherwise attending an event sponsored by the EISC. Others in attendance, though not members of our organization, also witness us as a group. When the activities of an individual infringe on the rights of the group as a whole, said actions are considered unacceptable. It is not out of the realm of possibility that your actions could prompt the board to revoke your membership.

Summary:

AS A MEMBER of the East Iowa Ski Club you will be entitled to a multitude of activities and advantages. Naturally, there are opportunities for friendship, places to go and people to see, but there is much more. Via our monthly newsletter, the Skiddoo, you will receive notices of all trips, parties and other numerous events.

You will know about what's happening in the club, who's doing what, with whom. Chances to buy, sell or trade, tips on clothing and exercises can be found via our website forums. You're eligible to attend all monthly meetings and events, summer activities such as kayak/canoe trips, bike rides, car cruises, etc. We've done them all!!! Volunteers are valued and essential to the club's success. We're always looking for folks willing to get involved and engaged. Keep a positive attitude and become involved in your club. Attitude is the difference between an ordeal and an adventure.
