The first major EISC West trip of the 2022 season is back to Breckenridge! This area has activities for skiers and non-skiers. Breckenridge is a very unique town with a variety of activities available. The towns of Fisco and Silverthorn are also within a 15-minute drive.


This mountain offers fantastic skiing for all abilities and is spread out over 2,908 acres, which includes five peaks! A new chairlift has been added to Peak Seven this year. It will make navigating the mountain much easier, as well as relieving the congestion at the base of peak seven. There are also groomed cross country and snow shoeing paths located along the base of the mountain.

We have 31 people registered so far, with room for 32. We will be staying in eight 2BR/2Bath suites at the Beaver Run resort. This ski in/ski out resort is one of Breckenridge's most popular.

The Beaver Run Resort offers a variety of amenities including an indoor/outdoor heated pool, a second outdoor pool, nine outdoor hot tubs, an exercise room, video arcade, retail stores, mini market/deli, bars and restaurants, ski and snowboard rental shops and complimentary in-town shuttle.

Parking is restricted during the winter to one vehicle per bedroom at a \$20 per day fee, so carpooling is suggested to keep the cost down.

EISC members will have to order their own Epic passes online. The EISC recommends using the [SKI.com](https://epicikon.events.ski.com/) link <https://epicikon.events.ski.com/> to buy your pass as [SKI.com](https://epicikon.events.ski.com/) offers a credit of \$30 on all Epic (except the Epic Day) Passes, when used on one of the EISC ski trips



We will spend two days at Caye Caulker which is an island with a village off the coast of Belize, located close to the world's second largest barrier reef. Our guide will lead us on a bike tour of the small island where golf cart rentals are also available. If you choose to snorkel you can see manta rays, sea turtles, parrotfish, nurse sharks, and other fascinating creatures as you swim through the warm tropical waters.

In the evening, choose to take a relaxing sunset cruise around the island. You can also opt to join a full-day sailing and snorkeling trip to Hol Chan Marine Reserve—the first marine reserve in Belize. Swim alongside schools of tropical fish in this spectacular natural aquarium and visit the Coral Gardens, perhaps spotting a manatee or two among the vibrant coral formations.

We already have 17 signed up for this all-inclusive (lodging, meals, and fishing) -but drive yourself – trip. This may be the easiest and best trip you could come across to fish and explore one of the most scenic lakes in northern Minnesota – Lake of the Woods. All you need is to pack a suitcase and “drive” to Baudette, Minnesota – an easy 500-mile day trip. This all-inclusive trip includes a double occupancy room in their spacious lodge, all your meals, and four full days of fishing in a guided boat. ***We are also looking for a trip leader.***

The lodge has a total of 30 standard lodge rooms. Each room has two queen beds, a full bathroom, and television with HBO, Wi-Fi, writing table, chairs and a freezer for your daily catch. All rooms are air conditioned; towels are provided and maid service is provided daily.

The meal plan included with this trip, includes three meals each full day starting with dinner on the day you arrive and breakfast on the day you leave. Dinner includes a full salad bar and soup, bread, a nonalcoholic beverage, and your choice from a large selection of steaks, seafood, walleye, chicken or ribs. You can either carpool, or drive yourselves to Baudette, Minnesota leaving Saturday, July 30th. Check in time is 3:00 pm. You'll just want to get there in time for dinner. You'll depart for home on the next Saturday, August 6th.

The next morning Yvonne Duggan took a helicopter ride that included landing on top of Tower

Butte. Meanwhile, many of us toured the Antelope Slot Canyon which was beyond words. The pictures will best describe it.

Next stop was Bryce Canyon with its eye-catching Hoodoos. The word hoodoo means “bewitch”, which is exactly what these rock formations do when you see them. We looked around, hiked and enjoyed the day.

Zion National Park was our next stop where we had a sack lunch and then headed to various hiking trails. It was another breathtaking park with its steep, red cliffs along the Virgin River. Two of the popular hikes among our group were the Emerald Pools and Riverwalk Trails. It was not disappointing.




Monument Valley
